Roll nos. 1-13 : Dictionary Skills

Eg. – Shackles, Shabby, Shadow, Shark etc.

Roll nos. 14-26 : Word Wall for New words

Decide a location- Think of a nice place where you can keep the wall which can be in form of a chart paper/sheet.

Material Required- Chart paper, colours, sheets, tape, decorative items and scissors.

Rule 1: Whenever you find or explore a new word, write it down. Following the Alphabetical order search for its meaning in the dictionary.

Rule 2: Write the word with a different pen/marker and meaning with some other colour. Now show some creativity by drawing them on other coloured sheets/paper using different shapes and art forms.

Rule 3: Stick the word with meaning on the chart paper acting as a wall. You can also draw pictures/paste picture in order to support the word and its meaning.

Students need to know how words are pronounced and the way to pronounce them.

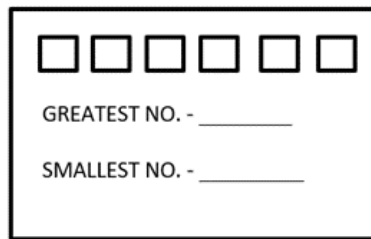
MATHEMATICS
