Our goal is to integrate learning with summer experiences, reinforcing the skills they have developed while encouraging curiosity and creativity.



GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:


- Holiday Homework will be graded.





ENGLISH

HAPPY MEAL MAT

Materials required:

- A4 white coloured sheet
- 1 bold permanent black marker for outlining
- Glitter tape
- Plastic crayons
- Origami sheet (for paper tearing and pasting)
- Scissors





Take a white A4 size sheet. First border the sheet on both the sides using glitter tape. On one side of the sheet make your ward write his/her first name in capital letters. Each letter should be of minimum 2 and a half inches long (2.5 inches). On the other side of the sheet, paste objects starting with each letter of your ward's name and write the first letter of each image. For example if the child's name is RIYA, then the child has to paste four objects each starting with the letters in the given name (image attached for reference). Laminate the same. Creativity will be appreciated. This will be utilized as a table mat during lunch break.

Note: Lamination is mandatory.

MATHEMATICS

SHAPE RANGOLI

Materials Required:

- A3 size light coloured pastel sheet
- Black marker
- · Coloured paper cutouts of different geometrical shapes
- Eco-friendly decorative material
- Glue



Take any light-coloured A3 pastel sheet for creating the base of rangoli. Place the coloured cutouts of different shapes (rectangle, square, triangle, circle and semi-circle) on the A3 pastel sheet to create a design for rangoli. Ensure that atleast three shapes are included and are clearly visible and neatly placed. You can repeat the shapes as per requirement. Encourage your child to choose colour and patterns. As you work, name the shape aloud and let your child help identify them to reinforce learning.

GENERAL AWARENESS

BOTTLE BLOOM

Materials Required:

- 2-litre soda bottle
- Marker
- Cutter/scissors
- Acrylic paint
- Paint pens
- Permanent marker
- Potting soil
- Plant seeds



Draw an animal outline on a clear, plastic bottle with a marker. Cut out the outline with cutter/scissors. Wipe off the marker outline from the cut-out bottle. The bottom part of the bottle will be used for the planter. Punch a few small holes in the bottom to allow excess water to drain out, preventing the plant's roots from sitting in water. Fill the bottom part of the bottle with soil, leaving some space at the top for the plant. Place your seeds into the soil and gently pack the soil around it. Now, coat the bottle with acrylic paint of any colour keeping in mind the animal selected and let it dry, adding a fun personal touch to your new planter. Draw the animal's face with paint pens and permanent marker.

NOTE:

- 1. Use a cutter/scissors to poke a slit in the bottle before cutting out the animal outline with scissors.
- 2. You can also use the box cutter to create small drainage holes on the bottom of the bottle.
- 3. It is advised to do this activity 15 days before the reopening of the school.




COMPUTER

MODEL OF A COMPUTER

Materials Required:

- Thick cardboard (for base and dividers)
- Coloured chart paper
- Scissors
- Glue
- Sketch pens/markers
- Printed or hand written labels
- 1 cardboard/paster sheet roll (for centre pillar)



Cut a round shaped cardboard of 30cm diameter for the base. Cover the base and the roll with the coloured chart paper of your choice. Fix the pillar at the centre of the base. Cut four rectangular pieces of cardboard to act as background walls. Paste any light coloured chart paper on them. Attach these background walls around the centre pillar, equally spaced. Now paste images/miniatures of models of different parts of computer like-monitor, CPU, keyboard, mouse etc on the background walls and label them neatly the base. Note: You may use the roll of toilet paper or alluminium foil to create the centre pillar.



ART AND CRAFT ACTIVITIES

Art allows children to practice a wide range of skills that are useful not only for life, but also for learning.

Activity 1 - Paper plate fish aquarium

Material Required:

- Paper plate/cardboard
- Shell/ stones
- Acrylic colours
- Fevicol/glue





Method:

- **Step 1**. Draw out the size of frame you would like to make or take a paper plate of medium size.
- **Step 2.** Cut out the frame, if using a cardboard. (Cutting can be done by parents)
- **Step 3**. Paste the shell / stones on the frame using fevicol.
- Step 4. Colour the stones and the water, grass etc.
