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❖ Mysuru-Location, Climate, Food, festivals, monuments, tourist attractions, any other special feature.

a. Location- Mysuru is located at the southwest of Bengaluru. Mysuru spreads an area of 128.42 square kms which extends at the foot hills of Chamundi Hills.

b. Climate- Mysuru enjoys a pleasant climate throughout the year. Summer season extends from March to June which is followed by the monsoon season in July to November.

c. Food- Mysuru's cuisine includes an exciting platter of spicy, richly flavoured dishes which we have grown to love.

1. Uppittu:- It is roasted, spicy semolina (sooji) flavoured with curry leaves. The same dish is also known as upma.

2. Shavige Bath – A version of upma that is cooked with vermicelli (rich noodles). Shavige Bath is best interpreted at the chowmein's South Indian cousin.

3. Huli or Saaru – A creamy broth of coconut, lentils and veggies. It is usually served for lunch. Other dishes include Rasam and pappad, Mysore Pak, Chakkuli, Bonda and Bajji, Dosa, Idli and Vada.

4. Festivals- Dussehra is celebrated in Mysuru with pomp. Ugadi festival marks the new years day for the people of Karnataka.

5. Tourist attractions- Mysuru is surrounded with a number of tourist spots in and around which include some prominent places like Mysore Palace, Chamunda Hills, Zoo, St Philomena's Church, Jaganmaohan Palace, Krishnrajsagar Dam, Brindavan Garden.
